Students throughout the school are working with their teachers and year groups to learn about Jesus.

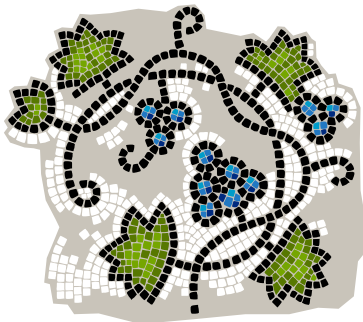
Students are learning that Jesus is our friend who loves us and is with us in many ways; in particular when we receive the Sacrament of Eucharist.

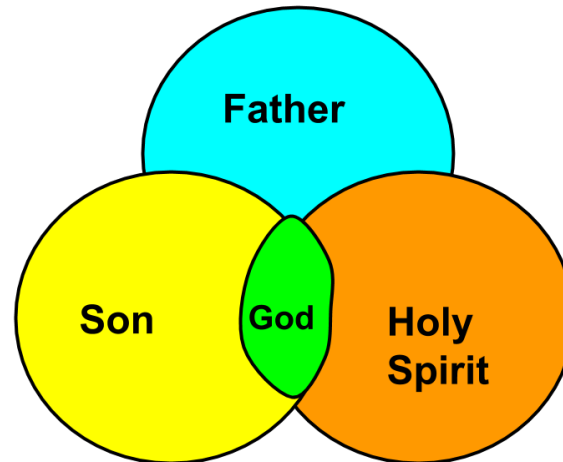
